


MTCC OVERVIEW MAP







In case of Fire Alarm

The MTCC operates a two-phase alarm system:

Stage 1: Slow beeping sound, alert signal

- Remain calm
- If the alarm is beeping slowly, this is a warning.

Stage 2: Fast beeping sound, evacuate signal

- Only evacuate the building if instructed to do so over the intercom or by Security Staff
- · Leave the building via the closest emergency stairwell
- Fire Exits are highlighted in yellow on the floor plans that can be found on pages 3 4
- Do not use elevators or escalators
- If you encounter smoke in the stairway, use an alternate exit
- Once outside, stay clear of the building to permit emergency access
- Do not attempt to remove vehicles from parking garages or loading docks
- Do not return until declared safe by the Fire Official

- If required, MTCC Nurse will be called to scene by MTCC Security







There is a current project to introduce new changes before the reform comes into effect.





2016 Mary-Claire Ward Geoscience Award Winner

This year's recipient of the Mary-Claire Ward Geoscience Award is Jordan McDivitt of Laurentian University.

His M.Sc thesis focused on the structural and hydrothermal evolution of gold mineralization in the Missanabie-Renabie district, Ontario, Canada by integrating detailed field mapping with a number of geochemical techniques. The product provides the data needed to characterize and constrain gold mineralization hosted within a ca. 2.72 Ga tonalite batholith in the context of regional geology and deformation. The results contribute to furthering the understanding of gold metallogeny in the district in order to aid the mineral exploration industry.

Jordan will receive his award at GAC-MAC 2016 to be held June 1-3 in Whitehorse, Yukon.The award, comprising \$5,000 and a certificate, is given annually and honors the memory of Mary-Claire Ward who







Various regulatory authorities across Canada have been regularly reviewing compliance with respect to disclosure requirements by corporations listed on the TSX and TSXV (Issuers) with surprisingly uniform results over space and time. The same types of errors appear frequently in spite of regular and frequent efforts to educate.

The course is addressed to Qualified Persons (QPs) and mining industry participants, particularly company executives and investor relations personnel and others interested in a better understanding of the obligations of Issuers and QPs with regard to disclosure of technical information related to mineral projects under NI 43-101.

The morning session will deal with common pitfalls and disclosure challenges at the various stages of development of a mineral project, through the use of case studies and examples of good disclosure practices for news releases, websites, investor relations materials and other written disclosure. The session will also include a discussion on technical reports and common issues that may require the technical report to be amended and re-filed.

The afternoon session will focus on best practices in the field, in the office and in mineral resource estimation. It will also provide guidance to industry practitioners with respect to the design of exploration projects, the collection of data used to prepare technical reports, mineral resource and mineral reserve statements and on the reporting of such information to the public. All the presentations will highlight those particularly troublesome

errors in disclosure that always make the top 25% of recurring problems seen during regulatory reviews.

The overall objective of the course is to help mining companies improve their disclosure compliance and avoid being called upon to explain or worse, to clarify or correct their disclosure with all its implications of time, money and reputation.

Structural vectoring in mineral exploration: What it is and how, when, and why we should use it

The goal of structural vectoring is to define the linkage between structural features and mineralization processes and use it to predict location, shape, orientation and continuity of mineral bodies. This linkage is particularly useful when drilling a mineral target. In this short course, we will present and discuss the concept of structural vectoring in mineral exploration and recommend a suitable workflow. In addition, we will show plausible ways to harmonize structural vectoring with geochemistry and geophysics to significantly improve exploration of mineral targets.

Since this course is centered on target evaluation and development, we will focus on structural vectoring concepts, tools and methods at the drilling stage. The instructors will present examples of real case mineralization-related structural features and discuss how to collect such data and use these features as predictive tools for direct drilling towards mineral bodies.

Short Courses

Strategies on what, why and how many structures should be collected to provide a robust dataset will be proposed to the group and debated. The guidelines for structural logging of core will be carried out by using core samples.

A new method of collecting structural features from oriented and non-oriented core, the V-SET® Method, will be introduced to attendees who will have the opportunity to compare its characteristics and strengths with current industry standard methods.

This practical exercise will help prepare attendees to solve their real case geometrical problems, leading to a better understanding of mineralization processes and their interactions with host architecture. The geometry of drilling and its interaction with a mineral body will also be discussed and viewed from the structural vectoring perspective.

The instructors will illustrate the usefulness of structural vectoring through a series of case studies.

The metallogeny and exploration for zinc ores: Meeting the challenge for new resources

Friday, March 4 and Saturday, March 5

In view of recent and pending closures of some worldclass zinc ore deposits, the discovery of significant zinc resources is needed to meet future world demand.

Given that "easy" discoveries are unlikely in the future, successful exploration must design robust exploration protocols that can prioritize targets based on our current knowledge of ore systems and understanding of what has or has not worked. This workshop provides an overview of the metallogeny of the most important sources of zinc ores: clastic-dominated, Mississippi Valley-type, volcanichosted massive sulfides and carbonate replacement deposits. Such ore deposits may also contain significant amounts of lead, copper, gold, silver, and critical elements such as germanium and indium.

The focus of the workshop is to provide the exploration geologist with practical, process-based exploration tools based on insights into why and where these ores form in the Earth's crust. The course will benefit graduate students interested in recent advances in ore models, exploration geologists targeting deposit to belt-scale resources, and exploration managers wanting an update on the most recent ideas.

Examples of the world's important mineral districts and giant deposits will be discussed to provide insights into the coupling of geological and geochemical host-rock attributes with tectonics, structural features, and fluid-flow that controlled ore deposition. To illustrate the variations within each ore type, discussions on the geological, structural and tectonic settings, alteration, zoning attributes, petrochemical constraints and distal footprints to ores will emphasize the spectrum of deposits and how to design robust exploration protocols. Case studies of discoveries and examples of field-based "exploration tools" and techniques will be presented. Ample time will be provided during the sessions to encourage discussions between participants and presenters.

Advancing exploration projects to production: Critical inputs for success SOLD OUT

To save time and money, exploration companies must continually reassess their projects. Financial viability is conclusively determined only after a detailed feasibility study is done and financing secured. However, prior to completing feasibility studies, other systematic studies can highlight opportunities and risks within projects. This can help exploration companies to make, in a timely manner, the right decisions about whether or not to advance their projects.

This course will describe the steps needed and issues to consider in advancing exploration projects to production. Topics to be discussed include: resource classification and prospects for economic extraction, an introduction to mining methods, mining method selection (open pit or underground), an introduction to strategic mine planning, fundamental concepts in mine design (e.g. cut-off grade, metal equivalent, net smelter return [NSR] calculation, and dilution), setting of economic parameters, mill production rate determination, mine production scheduling, stockpiling, mine economic analysis, an introduction to geotechnical engineering in open pit and

underground mines, metallurgical aspects of projects and their impact on project value, and processing options for dealing with increasingly challenging ore properties (e.g. very hard, low grade, or impure elements). Issues related to permitting, community relations, and environmental aspects of exploration projects will also be addressed.

Case studies and examples of real-life projects will be presented throughout both days of the course. At the end of each day, a few examples of cut-off grade and NSR calculations will be practiced.

- Learn how to streamline communication between geologists and mining teams

Structured Excel modeling, financial and risk analysis for mining

Metallurgy for geologists

A basic understanding of metallurgy, or more precisely, the geo-metallurgy of deposits, provides opportunities to develop projects in the most efficient manner possible. Knowledge of the metallurgy of a deposit minimizes costs and risks associated with the project development. It can reduce the time required to make informed decisions to bring projects into production, or to abandon them and move on to other projects that will be more likely to meet a company's objectives.

Collecting and interpreting metallurgically-related data is best initiated soon after the deposit discovery. Project development requires the support of interdisciplinary teams that consider not only the geology, but also mining requirements and methods, metallurgy and process design, and environmental and social awareness and understanding, among other things. Geologists are not commonly exposed to mineral processing at university. The goal of the course is to explain why the metallurgical response of geological deposits is oftentimes more important than the geological characteristics as a project moves into operations.

This one-day course is designed to provide exploration geologists and managers with an understanding of the essential components of sample selection, metallurgical test work, results interpretation, and the financial implications associated with the results. Case studies from current projects, with an emphasis on gold processing, will be included to demonstrate the principles that are presented.

- What are the important metallurgical properties and why do they matter?
- How to understand metallurgy starting from the beginning of exploration
- Best practices in geological/metallurgical sampling
- Sample selection criteria and requirements for metallurgical studies
- Selecting assaying protocols that also promote understanding of the metallurgy
- The role of geostatistical block models and geo-metallurgical modeling
- Introduction to mineral processing and "typical" flowsheets for gold recovery
- Geo-metallurgical characteristics that impact process design
- The value of integrating metallurgy with geology to make informed decisions
- Applying metallurgical and economic parameters into net smelter return calculations to estimate economic cut-off grades
- Review case studies, economics, and conclusions

DMEC workshop series: Making technology work; the importance of time and patience




