HEALTH AND SAFETY

In case of Fire Alarm, the MTCC operates a two-phase alarm system:

Stage 1: Slow beeping sound, alert signal

- Remain calm

- Do not use elevators or escalators
- If you encounter smoke in the stairway, use an alternate exit
- Once outside, stay clear of the building to permit emergency access
- Do not attempt to remove vehicles from parking garages or loading docks
- Do not return until declared safe by the Fire Official

- If required, MTCC Nurse will be called to scene by MTCC Security
- If required, MTCC Security will call ambulance

In bringing Irish geoscience expertise to international markets, Enterprise Ireland and GSI support Geoscience Ireland, a business development initiative for 28 companies winning overseas business in geoscience.

The Geological Survey of Northern Ireland (GSNI) provides geoscience information and services to inform decision-making and is part of Northern Ireland's Department for the Economy (DfE). GSNI is staffed by scientists of the British Geological Survey under contract to DfE to provide advice and support to the Minerals and Petroleum Branch (MAPB) which administers mineral exploration in Northern Ireland.

Ireland and Canada's mining industries have strong links dating back to the opening over 50 years ago of the Tynagh

mine in County Galway, a result of Irish entrepreneurship and Canadian venture capital. Since then, Ireland has become a significant producer of base metals, ranking third in Europe and fourteenth in the world for zinc.

2017 MARY-CLAIRE WARD GEOSCIENCE AWARD WINNER

This year's recipient of the Mary-Claire Ward Geoscience Award is Holly Steenkamp of Laval University.

Her PhD thesis involves new regional bedrock mapping in an underexplored part of the south-central Rae craton, in the Tehery Lake-Wager Bay area of northwestern Hudson's Bay, Nunavut. Holly is determining the areas regional tectonometamorphic history as recorded by supracrustal rocks. She will use the results to evaluate the character, timing, and duration of metamorphic processes that developed in this area associated with the 1.86-1.83 Ga Trans-Hudson orogeny.

Holly will receive her award at GAC-MAC 2017 to be held May 14-17 in Kingston, Ontario. The award, comprising \$5,000 and a certificate, is given annually and honours the memory of Mary-Claire Ward who died in 2004. Mary-Claire was the chair of the PDAC's Geoscience committee, Chairman of Watts Griffis McOuat Ltd., and a Past President of the Geological Association of Canada. She was a passionate advocate for the geosciences in Canada.

The intent of the award is to encourage and support a graduate student in Canada whose thesis contributes to our knowledge about the geological history of Canada. Mapping must be a significant component of the winning thesis.

The award is administered by the Prospectors & Developers Association of Canada, the Geological Association of Canada, the National Geological Surveys Committee, the Canadian Geological Foundation, and Watts, Griffis and McOuat Ltd.

World-class gold deposits: How do they form and what do we need to know to find them?

Improving strategic capital management with integrated valuation and risk modelling methods

Volatility in commodity prices and financial markets, compounded by technical uncertainty, make it difficult for mining professionals to assess risk exposures and identify factors influencing their Strategic Capital Management (SCM) decisions. Integrated Valuation and Risk Modelling (IVRM) methods are a toolkit comprising advanced finance theory, risk management concepts, decision analytics, and numerical methods that can be used to analyze a wide range of SCM problems. Types of applications include competing project development strategies, innovative financing structures, mergers and acquisitions, corporate portfolio risk, and enterprise risk management.

This workshop demonstrates why IVRM is an important extension to the static cash-flow models commonly used by industry. It includes an extended section discussing how to model commodity price uncertainty and estimate model parameters. Case studies are used to illustrate important IVRM concepts and their application to mining industry problems. The case studies include:

- The value and risk management benefits of staged development
- · Financing a project with a streaming agreement
- Assessing country risk in a corporate asset portfolio

Participants in the workshop will improve their understanding of how the IVRM framework can be used to recognize the unique cash-flow risk characteristics of individual projects, and how these characteristics influence value and risk at both a project and corporate portfolio level. Case studies are extensively used to provide a direct link between concepts and practical industry application.

U.S. Mining Law: An in-depth overview and refresher of the U.S. Mining Law relating to the acquiring, developing, permitting, financing and closing of hard rock mining claims and projects in the U.S.

This full-day course is a comprehensive overview of the mining law in the United States relating to the acquisition, exploration, development, operation and closure of hard rock mining projects. The course will provide in-depth coverage of the types of land and mineral ownership in the U.S., types of mineral claims, historical and current issues under the Mining Law of 1872, the process and issues involved in obtaining, holding and financing mineral tenures, along with an overview of water law in the Western U.S., and issues relating to acquisition and generation of electrical power for the operation.

The course will include an overview of the typical methods for entering into exploration and development joint venture arrangements, including the revised Rocky Mountain Mineral Law Foundation 'Form 5' limited liability company agreement, lease, purchase and sale of exploration and mining project issues, and a discussion of the standard royalty mechanisms including net smelter return and net profits interest royalties.

The course will also cover current significant environmental issues in the exploration and development of operations, including key air and water discharge issues, environmental impact statements, permitting of tailings facilities, bonding, and mine closure, and reclamation issues. Attendees will leave with an excellent foundation for understanding the major issues involved in acquiring, holding, financing and developing mining interests in the U.S., and the related environmental, water, power and closure issues. The course is ideal for persons who are interested in acquiring mining projects in the U.S., or simply wish to have a refresher on key concepts.

New exploration methods for base and precious metal deposits: How to increase success in Greenstone Terranes

Organizer: Laurentian University, Mineral Exploration Research Centre

Greenstone terranes continue to be an important metal source worldwide, but the mining industry needs new ideas and models to focus scarce exploration funds on the most prospective areas containing the next generation of ore deposits. The Mineral Exploration Research Centre (MERC) at Laurentian University's Harquail School of Earth Sciences develops exploration methodologies by conducting cutting-edge, field and laboratory research on mineral deposits and large-scale ore systems.

MERC's research is directed at: 1) developing a new understanding of the complex interplay of ore-system controls for volcanogenic Cu-Zn±Au, magmatic Ni-Cu-PGE and orogenic Au deposits; and 2) determining vectors to economic mineralization through integration of regional-and deposit-scale mapping with structure, stratigraphy (aided by geochronology), geophysical data (magnetic, electromagnetic, induced polarization and gravity) and geochemistry utilizing major and trace elements, fluid inclusion chemistry, and radiogenic and stable isotopes in rocks, minerals, ores and overburden samples.

The Short Course will draw insights from development of the Metal Earth project, a new seven-year, \$104 million applied R&D program with government, industry and academic partners that will expand and accelerate MERC's ore system research and provide new exploration models for gold and base metal deposits. The course will be taught by experienced economic geologists using case studies and up-to-date exploration models for greenstone-hosted deposits. Experts in precambrian geology, structural geology, geochemistry, geophysics and surficial geology will provide insight on the use of exploration tools for vectoring to economic mineralization. Integration of the combined topics will offer better tools to focus limited exploration dollars on quality targets.

Mining disclosure essentials: NI 43-101 reporting fundamentals, industry best practices and useful guidance for TSX and TSXV issuers

Your company makes a public disclosure about the results of mineral exploration and development activities, but is this reporting compliant with the requirements of NI 43-101 and the TSX/TSXV disclosure rules? This half-day Short Course is specifically designed to assist mining company executives, qualified persons, and investor relations personnel to understand their reporting obligations and improve their disclosure compliance.

Common reporting pitfalls and challenges at various stages of development of a mineral project will be covered using practical examples. Topics specific to both securities regulation and Exchange rules and policies will be reviewed, and an interactive news release exercise will also be included.

The Short Course will provide a discussion of technical reports and the common problems that may require the technical report to be amended and refiled. Examples of disclosure best practices and effective ways of meeting the form requirements of technical reports will also be covered.

A high-level comparison of the requirements of NI 43-101 with the recently proposed SEC mining disclosure rules in the U.S. to replace Industry Guide 7 will be discussed and the differences with NI 43-101 will be highlighted.

The overall objective of the Short Course is to assist mining companies and qualified persons with improving their technical disclosure compliance and avoiding a call from securities regulators, IIROC, or TSX/TSXV to clarify or correct their disclosure resulting in potential loss of time, money and reputation.




